Is AtariWorks and SpeedoGDOS for You? by George Terpening

I just got a really good deal from Toad Computers. I bought AtariWorks and SpeedoGDOS was included in the package for no additional cost. I saw their advertisement on the back cover of ST Informer and just had to get it! This is being done to introduce AtariWorks and SpeedoGDOS to the Atari community and probably will be short lived since the two products are really great. The price of the package is \$109.95 and if you just buy SpeedoGDOS by itself the price is \$54.95 (plus shipping). I also bought MultiTOS and a scalable font package. MultiTOS will be the subject of another article.

First about SpeedoGDOS. It is pretty easy to install on a hard disk. Just be sure you have enough space! Without the scalable font package installed you still must have around three megabytes of free space. The first thing I did was backup my hard disk and then I deleted all of my current crop of GDOS fonts (about 2.5 megabytes worth) and then I placed the Install disk in the drive and ran the program. The two programs are recommended for use on systems with a hard drive and a computer with two megabytes of memory. I then installed the font package which includes 50 scalable fonts. Now I have approximately 4.2 megabytes of my drive C dedicated to SpeedoGDOS. Is it worth it? Well I have used it with AtariWorks and Easydraw so far and have had no real problems. It seems to be compatible with Universal Item Selector, Word Perfect, Neodesk, Warp 9, Page Stream, Outburst!, and several other programs that I normally use. As a matter of fact, I haven't found anything that it isn't compatible with.

AtariWorks is everything you have seen advertised and talked about in the magazine articles. It is installed the same way that SpeedoGDOS was and requires about 2.6 megabytes of hard disk storage. The package comes with the program contained on three disks, a very well written manual, a quick reference card which is well layed out, and a certificate. The certificate allows you to get the upgrade which is in works for a little over four dollars when it is available. Even though the manual is very good, it does not contain an index which would be handy when using the book as a reference.

AtariWorks is an integrated

product made up of three parts. They are a word processor, a spreadsheet, and a data base. The first is a word processor which shares many of keystroke command replacements with the word processors available on the Mac. It also has many features of a document processor including being able to place graphics on a page and limited drawing capabilities. The page formatting capabilities are very impressive and one of the few complaints I have is that there are only limited import/export format (ASCII only). That means that all formatting codes are lost when transporting text from program to program (i.e. PageStream, WordPerfect, ST Writer, etc.). Also the normal word processor output formal is not compatible with any other program. Wait until you see the font selection method. They have a window open similar to that found in PageStream, but additionally there is a sample of the selected font shown while you are still in the selection window. This is really handy.

The spreadsheet is very much like all of the most popular ones on the other compute platforms (like Excel). It has most of normal spreadsheet features with some very impressive plot capabilities. Once you have generated your data plots, they can be exported directly into the word processor to include in your report.

The data base is met to allow you to build address lists and has limited capability when compared to programs like DBMan. Even at that it is very easy to use.

I'm sure that I will have more to say later after I have used the program for a while. Even Atari admits that it isn't the complete solution. They state in their manual that it was produced on an Atari TT030 computer using AtariWorks for the word processing and

PageStream for the desktop publishing.

Is the package worth the \$109.95 price? Yes! It is the best package that I have seen in the price range. It doesn't have all of the features of a WordPerfect, PageStream, DBMan, or Kspread but it can do most of the work of all of them together at one eight the price.

What About This MultiTOS? by George Terpening

I just picked up a copy of the new Atari program MultiTOS which will allow you to run more than one program on your plain ST computer (as long as you have at least two megabytes of memory, a hard disk with at least 3 megabytes of spare space, and at least version 1.04 of TOS in your computer). My STacy has four megabytes of memory and I managed to find the disk space.

The program was easy to install. All you need to do is insert the floppy disk in the drive and click on the Install program. That's all.

Now about the program. There are lots of current programs which do work with MultiTOS and there are a large number that I could not get to work in the several hours that I tried the program out. I did have AtariWorks, PageStream, and several disk drive windows open at the same time. What I found out is that PageStream is really 'sloooow' in this configuration. Screen redraws remind me of running the software version of PC-Ditto.

I found that when I brought the desktop windows to the front for use, the rest of the desktop remained behind the PageStream display. I had to guess where the drive window

World Class? What is this 'World Class' stuff7 Doesn't Atari sell products all over the world already? Well yes, but so does The Boeing Company. Boeing is considered by marly around the world as 'World Class' and by many measures it is. If you consider who sells more commercial aircraft every year and who provides the best support for those aircraft after they have been delivered to the customers (as determined by the customer airlines) then there is no question that Boeing is 'World Class'. Even at that Boeing is undergoing a cultural change to become even more 'World Class' and maintain their position as a world leader in their industry.

Is the Atari Corporation 'World Class' by these standards of being first in the field for their products or service? The answer is no. Their market share has shrank over the last several years after their initial dominance in the home computer and game field. I think so, and here is what I think they must do.

The most important thing that a company must do is make customer satisfaction the center of everything the company **does.Who** are these customers you may ask? Well, for Atari the most obvious answer is the people that have already bought their products and the several different classes that they fall into. There are the hobbyists, the students, the musicians, the game players, the small business person, and many others.

Customer satisfaction is determined through communications. This is communications between Atari and their customers. With such a large customer base, the most likely method of communications would take the form of customer surveys using written forms which are mailed to the customer base and personal interviews conducted over the phone or in person. This could provide Atari with a mechanism to determine their customer requirements for new products, improvements in current products, measure customer satisfaction, and resolve customer complaints.This type communications could also provide the customers with a feeling that Atari cares about them and is trying to satisfy their needs.

The failure of Atari to understand the needs of the 8-bit Atari community is an example of Atari not being 'World Class' and listening to their customers. I have attended meetings where an Atari official has addressed the group and implied that the 8-bit people did not understand what they needed and that Atari did. Atari wanted them to convert their hobby by replacing their 8-bit machines with a ST computer. Was Atari right? I don't think so. They failed to understand the needs of their customers and to understand the market which was opening up in eastern Europe where the eastern European's were (and still are) buying up all of the 8-bit computer equipment they can get their hands on. Why? Because the equipment is cheap appliance type equipment. That market is still there. The point is that 'World Class' companies support their products through out their life cycles, not just to the point of sale.

There are many companies around the world that have made the cultural change to become 'World Class'. The largest number of them are located in Japan, companies such as Toyota and Sony. We have our own American companies also such as General Electric, Ford, Harley-Davidson, and Pratt-Whitniey.

I could continue on but most of what I would be saying would be a repeat and refinement of what I have already said. Complete customer satisfaction must be the goal of the company, if it wants to become a 'World Class' company and maintain that status in an increasingly competitive world. Good Luck to Atari and I hope that they make the change and survive.



MEL'S MANOR

New and Improved by Mel Motogawa [M.MOTOGAWA]

MANYNEW IMPROVED PROGRAMS have been released lately that I thought it would be better to cover several now, in brief, rather than trying to cover each in-depth one month at a time and be discussing old hat in a few months. As usual, more information concerning these programs can be had on GEnie, in the ST Roundtable Bulletin Board.

Warp 9 3.80 It's hard to imagine anyone who hasn't heard of Codehead Warp from Technologies: a premier screen accelerator that offers many other helpful features. The version 3.80 update adds many desirable féatures like **Falconand** SpeedoGDOS compatibility, a redesigned Warp 9 Control Panel, a program for viewing Extend-0-View screen saver modules. 28 modules and much more. The two-disk set comes to over 1.3 megs of files. A 30-page version 3.80 manual addendum brings you up to warp speed quickly.

The screen saver modules can do things like mimic the concept of that popular flying screen saver on another platform, do a slideshow of graphic files, simulate rain drops on your screen, fade your screen to another or watch the current screen drop away piece by piece, throw up a fireworks display, flip or randomize your screen, bring up sets of eyes popping out to stare at you along with sound effects, create captivating ever-changing patterns or everchanging geometric shapes, blank the screen and have a spotlight pan around revealing the screen beneath. or show you page after page of your system's RAM. An idle screen will never be boring.

I'm impressed with the tremendous array of screen saving modules that are becoming available in the file library for Warp 9, particularly variations of the Flying Thrones module, since this particular module can be customized via the Image Swap program included with the package.

By using the Moving Pictures utility included with Warp 9, a randomizing of my favorite screen savers occurs at each bootup, adding a little more spice to one's system. There are plenty of options that can be toggled in the various Warp 9 modules, and the screen saving feature will keep you engrossed for hours.

Geneva 1.01

Geneva is a great new multitasking solution for the ST from Gribnif Software. Not only does it allow you to multitask programs, but you can customize the appearance of your windows and dialogs and assign keyboard equivalents to many of their gadgets or buttons. The elimination of the 6-desk-accessory limit, loading and removing accessories anytime, tear-away menus (where you can drag a drop down menu into its own menu), activation of drop down menus via the keyboard, a hypertext Help system, and much more, puts plenty of power at your command.

Although a few programs I normally use crashed on the version .95 beta, the 1.01 release version is much improved and remarkably crash resistant. There is one oddity of some text being invisible when you enter it in some editable fields, but the Gribnifs have a reputation for fast fixes and their support for Geneva in Cat. 17, topics 19 and 22, has been exemplary.

A nice 3-ring binder and slipcase houses the manual, which includes a table of contents and index. The first

107 pages covers the program indepth, with many screenshots, while the next 56 pages contain programmer guidelines. I thought that was a great idea so other programmers could easily support Geneva. Geneva is an amazing program with solid support behind it, which makes for a winning team. If you're eager to get multitasking, you need Geneva.

Ultimate Virus Killer 5.9

Viruses are a sad reality on many computer platforms today. But one doesn't have to lose control of one's system, or worse, lose precious data. The Ultimate Virus Killer, distributed by Oregon Research Associates, can check for and eliminate boot sector or link viruses and repair the boot sectors on rnany game disks.

UVK has been around for a while, and over the years the scope of the program has grown considerably. It now boasts being able to seek and destroy 72 boot sectors and 5 link viruses. 669 boot sectors can be repaired, so if you've ever had a virus zap your favorite game's boot sector, help is on the way. A staggering 1390 different boot sectors are recognized by the program. 31 packer formats are recognized so you can ferret out link viruses hiding within a packed program.

A worthy upgrade, you'll find that UVK can now run either as a program or a desk accessory. There is a half-meg version, for those with 520 ST's. A UVK CPX offers limited functions compared to the full program. A long new features list assures you that this upgrade was worth the money. The virus history text file describes the particularly nasty Beilstein virus, a mutating variety like those unpopular in the DOS world. But it too can be identified by UVK. I sleep comfortably From GEnieLamp Atari ST A T/TalkNET OnLine Publication Vol. 3, Issue 62

knowing that UVK is in the toolbox.

Powerdos 1.12

Just a guick mention that a new release of Powerdos (file #30263) is in the file library. The speedup over normal GEMDOS this utility provides in file deletes, copies, moves, and file creation is truly amazing. The numbers I get from Quick Index and Ness Benchmark, for disk tests, are a sight to behold. That's all for now.

Another thing that I found out was that if I had a drive window located over the PageStream tool area and had to bring the drive window to the front, the tool area could not be brought back to the front for use. I solved this problem by not including any windows behindlover this area and then everything worked fine. I was able to switch between AtariWorks, PageStream, and desktop drive windows successfully but all operations were slowed down. I would like to try this with a 16MHz processor installed in my STacy.

Overall I think I need more time to try this product before making a final decision on permanently installing it.
