View II is a shell that is installed at system boot time which allows you to click on any text file (no matter what it is named), most kinds of picture files (PI?, PC?, TNY, TN?, NEO, DOO, ART, SPU, SPC, SPS), archive files (ARC or LZH), digital sound files (AVR, SPL, SAM), and animation files (SEQ, DLT). The program comes on a single double sided disk with a 18 page manual. The manual is written in a very easy reading style.

The program is very easy to install and is compatible with most software available for the ST series. The installation allows you to choose what archive programs you want to use as well as many other options. It also can be used on any ST series computer including the TT and the Falcon. The program only requires about 50 k of storage and will operate from floppy disk or from hard disk. Once you try it, it will become your viewing program of choice. December was a heavy graphics month with a new modular version of powerful graphics viewer GEM-View, version 3.01, appearing in the ST RT File Library. The POV ray tracer, version 2.0, and a GEM shell for it, should prove popular. Several other graphic based programs were the TLC Icon Creator, Deskpic, which allows using a GIF pic as a background picture, and the Agenda graphic calendar creator. As always, enjoy!

Any comments of my own are shown within double asterisks "***...**" after the file description, in the ASCII GENie Lamp version, and also in italics in the TX2 version. (If you haven't experienced reading the Lamp in TX2 format, why not download the TX2 file viewer (file #20441) by David Holmes? You may be surprised at the versatility and power of this program, above and beyond viewing TX2 Lamp issues.)

Updated version of the 2in1 archive shell, now 90% in English. Provides an STZip-like interface for LZH, ARC, ARJ, ZOO, and ZIP archive programs (not included). Shareware from Germany. Extract with STZip

CWAC v3.02 is the latest (and probably last) version of this _excellent_ archive conversion program. MEL'S MANOR

Enhancing ST Aladdin via Geneva

What Is It? Geneva is an intriguing multitasking application environment recently released by Gribnif Software. Besides allowing you to experience multitasking on an ST, it offers more than 6 accessories at a time and up to 256 open windows, better looking windows and dialog boxes, tear away menus, keyboard equivalents for menu bar items and dialog/alert buttons, an alternate file selector and mouse pointer, a built-in help system and much, much more. Besides offering impressive power, Geneva puts the fun back into one's general use of the ST and I've found it enhances my use of ST Aladdin. Here are a few examples.

Custom Hotkeys Since Geneva allows you to alternate between open windows via a user definable keypress, I find this convenient when editing replies to messages or email. The Shift-up/down arrow key combos move you up/down one screen at a time in ST Aladdin, so I assigned a nearby key combo, Shift-Insert, as my Geneva window cycling hotkey. Now I can quickly switch between the message window and my reply without using the mouse, and moving up/down in the message/reply window is very convenient.

For those times when you want to respond to several emails or messages in one reply, you can load these into Edhak, a great GEM desk accessory editor, and then cycle between your ST Aladdin reply window and Edhak, keeping both open. This is very convenient versus constantly opening and closing your Edhak window (or topping/untopping it via the mouse) to reread your email or messages while composing your reply. This also works well if you're using Edhak to Kwiksend various

parts of a file into the ST Aladdin editor or some other GEM application. Edhak is always ready, right behind your open window, just waiting to be topped by Geneva's window cycling hotkey.

Geneva's ability to select menu bar items from the keyboard makes it easy for me to select menu bar items that don't already have a keyboard equivalent. Formerly, I used Codekeys to execute mouse click on the appropriate item(s), but now I tell Codekeys to execute the Geneva equivalents for the menu bar, which seems slightly faster. And when it comes time to edit a menu bar macro, Geneva's keyboard equivalents are much easier to use than editing X,Y coordinates.

Alert Box Enhancements Geneva's keyboard equivalents for alert and dialog box buttons makes it easy for one to respond to many of these in ST Aladdin. In particular, the alert that pops up when you reach the end of one RT's messages. If I don't want to proceed to the next RT's messages, I simply press Undo and the "No" button of the alert is selected. No more reaching for the mouse. But if you prefer the mouse, Geneva has an option for having the alerts follow the mouse, which means that this alert will always pop up beneath your mouse pointer for minimal effort in positioning over the appropriate button.

Making Some Room I enjoy seeing as much text as possible, so I have my GEM window vertical scroll bar set to a width of 2 in Geneva. (Yes, you can set the width and height for the title bar and sliders on GEM windows with Geneva.) I get a tad more horizontal resolution but can still see the scroll bar for those times I have to use the mouse when the usual Shift-up/down arrows have no effect.

Customability If you find yourself

accidentally hitting a key combo that you're accustomed to using with one of Geneva's options, yet ST Aladdin uses it for a necessary function, you can use Geneva's Reserve Key function to have Geneva ignore this key combo while ST Aladdin is running and pass it on to ST Aladdin. A very thoughtful touch by Gribnif.

And although I've never really had a problem with it, if you find the scroll gadgets on the ST Aladdin's File Library List's window to be a little touchy, you can adjust the Window Gadget Repeat Delay in Geneva, which allows you more time to let go of the mouse button before the window scrolls again.

Geneva certainly is a great program that offers many more powerful features and options. The enhancements it offers to so many programs makes it well-nigh indispensable. Check out the latest Geneva information in Category 17, topic 19 in the ST Roundtable.

Here's some news from the GENie roundtables!

Aladdin:

Aladdin ST, GENie's telecommunications program and the new Atari Falcon computer have a compatibility problem, but fear not a fix is in the works. Right now a fix is being beta tested and the bugs are being fixed, so hopefully Falcon owner will be able to use Aladdin soon.

CD-ROM Drivers:

Rogers Burrows of Anodyne Software is working on a CD-ROM driver that won't require MultiTOS, this would allow it to be used on all Atari ST /

STE / TT / Falcon computers.

Falcon SLM Interface:

Word is that a German Developer has made an interface that allows the connection of the Atari SLM laser printers to the new Falcon computer. It is available now in Germany, whether it will find its way to the U. S. is another story. It is said to be a small interface that plugs into the DSP port replacing the SLM804 interface and it doesn't matter if the printer is on or off at boot up time.

2 Column Upgrade:

A new version on the popular 2 Column printing utility program is being beta tested. Changes are mostly in the user interface and memory management. It will also run under MultiTOS and Geneva. The program is bigger and runs a little slower, but is much more flexible.

XtraRAM+8:

Marpet Developments of the U.K. the people who made a real nice 8 meg ram upgrade board for your Mega ST, now offer a 8 meg board for your 520 or 1040 STE computer. In development is a 8 meg board for the Mega STE that should be available in March 94'. Populated models cost \$465 to \$525 and a unpopulated board runs about \$119.

TRACKER/ST:

Step Ahead Software, Inc. has announce that for the next 3 months, (through March 31, 1994), a free copy of the Windows version of Tracker/ST will be included with every copy of Tracker/ST for the Atari. With the Atari version retailing for \$99.95 and the Windows version for \$119.95 you get one of the greatest 2-for-1 packages ever!

Tracker/ST has been regarded as the leading mailing list program for the Atari ST. The The latest version (v3.04) is fully compatible with all Atari computer, from the original 1040ST

right through to the Falcon.

ICD SCSI Pro Utilities:

The suggested U.S. retail price for ICD SCSI Pro Utilities is \$49.95. It is available directly from ICD or from better Atari dealers everywhere.

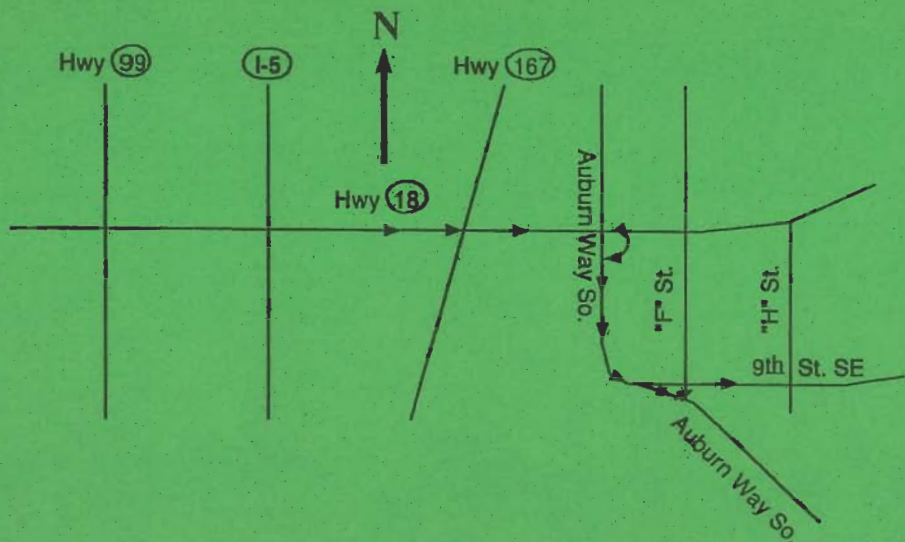
