## **How to Play**

As pies come out on the conveyor, you must run up to the whipped cream bin, get a can of whipped cream, squirt it on the pie, go to the cherry bin, take a cherry, put it on the pie, then take the finished pie and put it in the pie bin. Watch out for flour sacks and grease spots on the floor, and the slightly tipsy wedding-cake baker delivering his creations. Oh yes . . . if you let 7 pies fall to the floor, you'll be fired.

PIE MAN's tray must be directly under the bin dispenser to pick up the whipped cream or cherries and to put away the finished pies. When pies are on the conveyor, PIE MAN's hand must be directly over the pie to put on the whipped cream or cherries and to pick up the finished pie.

## **Controls**

PIE MAN must be played with a joystick. The joystick controls your movement. Pressing the button lets you pick things up or put them down, depending on where you are. If you find yourself carrying the wrong ingredient, touching any key on the keyboard lets you drop whatever you are holding.

The ESC key will pause the game. Touch it again to restart.

The OPTION key toggles the sound on and off.

## **Loading Instructions for Cassette Version**

1. Remove all cartridges from your Atari computer.
2. Advance the tape by hand up to the beginning of the brown magnetic tape (to the end of the yellow leader tape).
3. Put the tape in your recorder and press Play.
4. Hold down the START key on your Atari and turn the computer on.
5. After the short tone, release the START key and press any other key to begin loading
